Grant Writer Report

The Grant Writer project is a project for the East District with the support of District Superintendent Rev. Moonyoung Lee and East District Change Manager Rev. Catie Coots. This work is intended to assist in funding sustainable ministry throughout the East District and the conference. We have completed year two of the three-year project.

We are grateful for the past two years of funding from the New Ministries EMT. We have a lean operation. Catie Coots supervises the work as part of her role as Change Manager for the East District. Eric Schmidt serves as the grant writer on a half-time basis. Half of his salary and benefits are covered by the New Ministries funding. Our only other major expense is for a subscription to Instrumentl, a grant management software tool.

We have had some successes to date. The best intended outcome has been the funding received by the Imperial Beach Neighborhood Center, who received a \$35K grant from the Alliance Healthcare Foundation for capacity-building. This was a South District project.

The next best outcome was an 8-week Grantwriting Cohort which we held from July-September 2024. Thirty-five people participated, representing all five districts of the Cal-Pac conference.

An unintended outcome was the participation of a delegation from the Oregon-Idaho conference, including the special assistant to the Bishop. Our new assistant to the Bishop, Rev. Paige Eaves, was one of our presenters. We held a 6-week check-in in October 2024. We are still following up with the teams in 2025.

We regularly work with local churches and their non-profit groups. We helped submit ten grant applications in 2024, while researching dozens, if not more than a hundred opportunities.

The Grant Writer is part of weekly staff meetings and participates in DPAS meetings to provide transparency and collaborate with District initiatives. This project serves as a pilot for the greater church. We are happy to share the resources and learning with any group interested in this work. In March 2025, the Oregon-Idaho conference asked for us to share our resources and presentations, which we are happy to do. This is a good sign our work is of value.

One note: in the currently changing environment, competition for funding is stiff, and some funding sources are taking a cautious approach. Nevertheless, we will continue to help churches seek funding and provide training to those who are interested in developing these important sustainability skills.

District Camping Report

In 2024, Camp Wrightwood challenged our campers and Counselors to truly step out of their comfort zones and imagine something different for themselves. Imagining what it truly means to matter, to be loved, to belong, to make a difference, and to create change in this world. And we were met with enthusiasm:

- We had over 100 campers and 45 staff this summer. We received campers from all four mainland districts, with a large concentration in the East District.
- Before the 2024 Summer, we hosted two work days where we cleared out the outdoor chapel into usable space, removed fencing, cleared ground brush, and built community between 7 churches. Work days offer a way for families of churches to raise money to offset camp funds for their campers. We hosted two more in the spring of 2025, restoring and maintaining our site for this summer.
- Each year our Graduating seniors pick a project around camp to leave as their legacy. This has been a tradition since 2016 and has added some of our favorite elements to our site. This year the Graduates transformed two platforms that have not been accessible for use into stable and usable space. We plan on integrating prayer stations there this summer for small groups to move through throughout the week.
- In January, we hosted 12 young adults in the huddle hut who took a weekend to discuss their faith journeys and how to move through theological conflict together instead of avoiding it. They moved through this time together with Grace and understanding, while still challenging each other to live deeper into Christ.
- Over Presidents' Day weekend, Camp Wrightwood buzzed with the energy of more than 100 campers, staff, and volunteers, all coming together for an unforgettable winter retreat. From kindergarteners to high school seniors, campers explored faith through the elements of earth, light, and air while making memories that will last a lifetime. This is to prepare them for Summer and Waves of Faith.
- Waves of Faith is a curriculum that we decided on and worked with each site team to create a curriculum focusing on Water and Faith.
- We are proud of the community we have built over the years, and especially from our counseling staff. We get to celebrate school graduations, weddings, new additions to families, big moves, and new jobs. We also stood alongside some deep losses in the camp community. We often also hear from campers' families when they need prayers and support. Connecting between seasons drives our program!

If you have youth in your church please promote camp. We have a work day on May 10th. As I mentioned earlier, this is a great opportunity for youth and parents to see the camp and meet some of the staff. We start around 10am and finish up before 3pm. Lunch is included and you can earn scholarship funds toward camp fees.

Church Building and Location Report

East District Building and Location had another busy year of reviewing and approving local church leases and property sales. We faithfully adhere to the guidelines of the Book of Discipline for our work. (Paragraph 2520, 2521, 2524 and 2541)

This past year, we reviewed and approved the following churches' requests:

- Banning UMC and Renu-Hope Foundation
- FUMC of Fullerton and Vine Church Orange County who will sublease some of their space to Vineyard Fullerton Church
- Property Sale of Church of the Good Shepherd in Long Beach
- Glendora Parsonage lease to former pastor
- Brea's lease with Korean Church.
- La Verne UMC lease with HeadStart
- Hesperia Vacant Lot Sale
- West Covina UMC Leases, La Habra UMC
- Victorville UMC request to sell Old Barstow UMC Campus and the Hinkley Lot
- Yucaipa UMC lease with Renu Hope (Head Start)

We continue to work with the churches in the district who are exploring the opportunities to utilize properties in the coming year in new leases and sales of properties. We are grateful for their faithfulness to the stewardship of our resources. When reviewing leases and sales, we want to ensure the churches are not overreaching and that they are protected. We want to ensure the terms of the leases are reasonable and protected for our local churches.

FYI: Guidelines for Property Development Projects and Lease Agreements and the process.

Property Development Projects:

If your church is considering property development projects, please be aware that there are specific procedures in place. It has recently come to our attention at the district office that some churches within the East District have received misleading information suggesting they can bypass the district and our UM procedures. I want to clarify that this is not accurate. If your church wishes to explore property development projects, I kindly request that you contact Rev. Catie Coots, East District Change Manager (catiecoots@me.com), or Ms. Sandee Furuta, CalPac's Associate Director of District Properties and Congregational Loans (sfuruta@calpacumc.org). Initiating these contacts and

engaging in subsequent conversations will reflect our shared commitment to transparency, cooperation, and a collective vision for our church properties.

Lease Agreements:

In accordance with Paragraph 2541 of the Book of Discipline, the local church needs to be approved by its charge/church conference in order to lease or rent church property for a duration of 30 days or more. Furthermore, the consent of the District Superintendent and approval from the District Board of Church Location and Building are also required. While these requirements may seem cumbersome, it is a crucial step in the process to ensure that the lease aligns with the district's mission and values while also safeguarding the best interest of the local church.

Once again, I want to thank our District Superintendent, Rev. Moonyoung Lee and the Change Manager, Rev. Catie Coots who have provided leadership, resources, vision and guidance. I would like to thank Dany Caguin, Administrator of East District Office for dealing with correspondence and setting up ZOOM meetings, etc. And of course, my deep appreciation extends to our members: Rev. Jon Waterson, Ed Hume, Khanh Doan, Rev. Riju Jayan and Sherri Cort for their faithful work, expertise and dedication.

We look forward to serving local churches as we work together in fulfilling our shared mission in the coming year in God's Grace.

We met three times by zoom, and voted on one matter by email.

We approved \$327,364.71 worth of funds in support of four local churches, and provided a modest sum to provide pulpit supply for one clergy renewal leave.

In August of 2024, we sent a team of clergy to the School of Congregational Development. They were asked to report back to the DPAS on their learnings, and how what they learned might help the district. We received one report.

District Committee on Ordained Ministry Report

In accordance with ¶666.1 of *The Book of Discipline*, "the district committee on ordained ministry [DCOM] shall be amenable to the annual conference through the board of ordained ministry." The East District Committee on Ordained Ministry is charged with interviewing and evaluating candidates who believe they are called to serve in various expressions of lay and licensed/ordained ministry.

Between July 1, 2024, and April 15, 2025, the East DCOM convened five times and conducted a total of 33 interviews with individuals pursuing lay and licensed ministry. For statistical reporting, the interviews were categorized as follows:

- In-Person Introductory Interviews: 5
- Recertification/Annual Renewal of Local Pastor License: 19
- Recommendation for Provisional Membership: 6
- Renewal of Certified Lay Minister License: 2

Additionally, the DCOM will meet again on April 29–30, 2025, to conduct 12 scheduled interviews:

- Certification Interviews: 8
- Recertification Interviews: 3
- Renewal of Certified Lay Minister License: 1

Current candidate statistics for the East District are as follows:

- Certified Candidates for Ordination: 20
- Declared Candidates: 31
- Local Pastor Track Candidates: 10
- Certified Lay Ministers: 9

This year has marked a significant period of transition as the Board of Ordained Ministry has worked to ensure the implementation of revised requirements in the updated *Book of Discipline*. In addition, there has been a renewed and collaborative effort to create a more collegial and meaningful ordination process. The East DCOM continues to work closely with the Board of Ordained Ministry to provide candidates with resources and tools that will support their development throughout the discernment and credentialing/ordination process.

We are encouraged by the dedication and faithfulness of our candidates as they continue to pursue the ministry to which they are called. It is our sacred responsibility and privilege to accompany them on their spiritual journeys. We hope that all East District clergy and laity will continue to support, guide, and uplift our candidates as they grow in faith and service.

As I conclude my term as Chair of the East DCOM in June, I am grateful for the opportunity to have served in this role. I look forward to continuing my involvement as a committee member in the coming year. I would also like to extend heartfelt thanks to the Rev. Eric Schmidt, who has served with distinction as our DCOM Registrar. His work has been marked by efficiency, grace, and deep commitment.

We offer our sincere gratitude to the DCOM members who will be rotating off this year—it has been a pleasure and a blessing to serve alongside you. We also warmly welcome the incoming members who will be joining us in this important work.

Finally, we **celebrate Pastor Moon Youn Kong, who will be received as a Provisional Member** at the 2025 California-Pacific Annual Conference.

District Treasurer Report

Two events were hosted in 2024 by the East District Ministries Team that were processed through the East District Ministries checking account.

On January 14, 2024, a Pastor's Appreciation Dinner was held for all East District pastors and spouses at Wesley UMC in Riverside. A total of 102 pastors and spouses attended the event, plus 12 additional people who helped with the event management and provided entertainment.

The total cost of the event was \$4,068.23. Contributions of \$785.00 were received, and the East District Superintendent paid for the remainder of the balance due. There was no cost ascribed to the checking account.

Stone Fire Grill in Rancho Cucamonga catered the dinner. They received many praises for the quality and serving of the main dish of tri-tip and lemon garlic chicken breasts.

On August 12, 2024, a retirement celebration for Karen Britten, Administrative Assistant to the District Superintendent, was held by Zoom. Gifts were collected by members of the East District that amounted to \$1,070.00. That amount was sent to her at her new residence. A bouquet of flowers was also sent to her, as well as a gift certificate for lunch, which she used during the celebration. The cost for the flowers and gift certificate was \$188.13.

District Union Report

The East District Union continues to be a dynamic, mission-driven team committed to empowering and revitalizing the churches within our care. With a strong focus on collaboration and service, the Union operates at the intersection of real estate, legal matters, and ministry—three critical areas where many of our churches face ongoing challenges. By leveraging the team's diverse expertise and working in close partnership with District leadership, the Union has once again upheld its mission in 2024: to assist congregations in financial need and to help ensure that worship and ministry can continue in safe and inspirational spaces.

After several years of thoughtful deliberation and strategic planning, the Board moved forward in early 2024 with new investment initiatives. Edward Jones, Charles Schwab, and Premier Bank were selected as financial partners, tasked with generating sustainable revenue. In less than a year, these investments yielded an impressive return—approaching a quarter of a million dollars—a milestone that marks a significant achievement in our pursuit of long-term financial stability.

This commitment to rigorous financial stewardship stems from a clear and pressing goal. Many of our churches are grappling with growing maintenance and repair costs. Operating on lean budgets, congregations often struggle to cover these essential expenses, and traditional property insurance alone is not a feasible solution. The District Union is stepping in to bridge this gap—providing the financial support necessary to preserve the functionality and integrity of our church buildings.

As we look ahead, the East District Union remains steadfast in its vision: to ensure that every church under our care has the resources it needs not only to survive but to thrive. By pursuing financial sustainability today, we are investing in the future of ministry in the East District for generations to come.

The East District Union is pleased to announce that the annual budget for the 2025 calendar year has reached a historic milestone of \$540,000—doubling the size of previous budgets due to a unique and pressing need. A significant portion of this year's budget has been designated to support a church within our District facing an acute financial crisis. While such an allocation would have been beyond our capacity just a few years ago, we are deeply grateful to now be in a position where we can respond decisively. This progress is a clear reflection of how far we have come—evidencing not only our growth but our increasing self-sufficiency as a District Union.

We are especially thankful for the unwavering support of the South District. In our own time of great financial difficulty, the South District extended a generous hand of partnership. Their anticipated contribution this year will provide additional momentum as we work toward our next phase of financial sustainability and expanded service.

For congregations in need of financial assistance to address building-related issues, both loan and grant applications are readily available at the District office. We also encourage churches to explore support through the congregational loan office of the Annual Conference, which offers both loans and conditional grants. While available funds may not always allow us to cover 100% of the costs, the District Union remains committed to doing everything within its power to equip and empower churches to thrive in their ministries.

Together, with continued stewardship, collaboration, and faith in our shared mission, we look forward to another year of impact and growth throughout the East District.
