A Crisis

A crisis exists! United Women in Faith's response through its *Just Energy 4 All* campaign is critical. Your North District Leadership Team has committed to doing what it can as it carries out its work. Among other measures, bringing one's own beverage container to gatherings will be encouraged in order to reduce the waste that goes into our landfills. A recent *response* magazine (November/December 2024) article offered these suggestions so you can be part of the solution:

- Donating, rather than discarding, gently used clothing and household items
- Using laundry detergent eco sheets and toilet bowl eco strips to eliminate plastic jugs
- Choosing digital over printed receipts
- Wasting less (water, leftover food)
- Avoiding single use plastics
- Using compost barrels
- Selecting public transportation or carpooling
- Recycling aluminum, glass,

We are only a small piece in the whole climate justice puzzle, but to complete the puzzle, every single piece is needed, however small. What will be your "piece of the puzzle?"

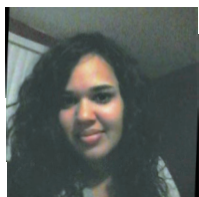

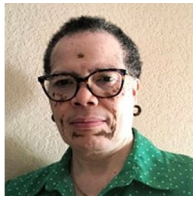

Alicia and the Hurricane:

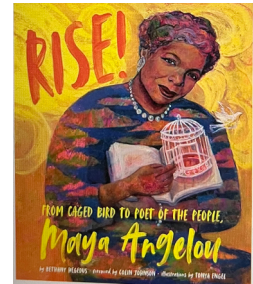

At the Mid-Winter Event are members of the Women's Auxiliary. We welcome you to talk with us and learn more about this historic group of women who, in 1903 in Los Angeles, saw a need to improve women's health care and founded the Methodist Hospital, now named USC Arcadia Hospital!

Since then, there have been many changes. But consistent has been our care for the spiritual welfare of the whole patient.

We are grateful to meet regularly face to face with hospital executives, such as President and CEO Ikenna "Ike" Mmeje, who describes why USC Arcadia has become recognized as one of the best in Southern California. The president of the hospital foundation, Sandra Chen Lau also makes time to offer reports of the wonderful support of the foundation that makes advanced technology of specialized treatments possible. Our Cal-Pac UWF President, Jackie Campbell, serves as a director on the Board of Directors.

Last September, we heard from Ms. Gwen Y. Blackmon, the director of the Kathy Kredel

Nursery School of the hospital. We learned that this day care facility, so near the hospital, started decades ago with the encouragement of the Methodist Women who knew it would support the employees with children. Ms. Blackmon described some of the exterior updating in the plans that will benefit children's outdoor experiences. When we asked how we might support the nursery school, she shared this wish list:

Balance bikes for preschoolers and toddlers; stepping stones for children 2-5 years old; a Big Dog Sandbox Digger Excavator Crane; shovels and buckets for 2-5 year olds; other outside toys; and gardening materials, such as clay pots and seeds.

Whenever we meet, we are sure to stop at the lovely gift shop which is our main source of revenue. The volunteers can be young people, but the more demanding tasks need to be done by adults who can devote 2-4 hours regularly. **We need you!** This shop funds the support of the Spiritual Care Department in addition to our membership dues and gifts.

**United Women in Faith on
USAID: To Continue to Freeze
Aid Is to Break With Precedent
and Sacrifice Human Lives**

NEW YORK – Following the administration’s decision to shutter the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), **United Women in Faith** expressed concern for the millions of individuals and programs served by USAID. They lamented the challenge the lack of funding will have on core programs, including **Africa University**, which is affiliated with The United Methodist Church:

“It is imperative that the courts step in and save the lives of thousands of persons served by programs of USAID, including Africa University. To continue on this path of cruelty, in the freezing of foreign aid, is to break with precedent and sacrifice human lives. With each passing day, humanity hangs in the balance.

“We shouldn’t wait to see bodies piled up in international streets to take action. Nor should we allow our conscience to be desensitized to the pleas and pain of our

brothers and sisters abroad.

“USAID was mandated by Congress, and the government has a responsibility to act. People of faith must hold their representatives accountable for doing so. We are urging all members of United Women in Faith to call their congressional leaders and plead for mercy and action.

“We are also reminding the nation of these words from Matthew 25:37-40: *“Then the righteous will answer him, saying, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?’ The King will reply, ‘Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.’”*

Cast Your Eyes Forward

I recently addressed the New Mexico Conference United Women in Faith, where their annual meeting theme was “Loving Wastefully.” What an interesting concept to ponder in this new year.

As we pursue abundant life and joy for ourselves, we are also called to inspire others to seek their hopes and aspirations—as we seek it for others, we find it for ourselves.

NEW YORK – United Women in Faith today lamented with the people of California over the devastating wildfires there. The fires were exacerbated by the climate crisis which has brought prolonged droughts and hardships to communities already struggling to access support.

The organization released the following statement:

“Our hearts are in agony over the devastating wildfires in California. We mourn with the Altadena, Pacific Palisades and the entire Los Angeles community. We grieve with those who are grieving over the loss of life, the loss of ways of life, and the loss of items that contributed to a family’s well-being. We can only imagine the pain of going to sleep in one’s home only to be displaced several hours later. The trauma of the fires cannot be understated.

“We are holding all impacted persons in our hearts and prayers. We are also mindful of the unique challenges of communities of color, low-income communities, persons who are unhoused, renters, and persons who are incarcerated. They are particularly vulnerable. These groups have also historically faced barriers

accessing FEMA funds and resources in emergencies. We pray that they — and all impacted persons — obtain the support and resources they need to rebuild.

“We know that in times of natural disasters or conflict, women, children, and youth are uniquely vulnerable. They are more likely to be displaced, more likely to suffer from gender-based violence, and more likely to struggle to rebuild. We are also concerned about the acute vulnerability of young people currently incarcerated near the wildfires.

“We pray that the nation’s leaders take seriously their responsibility to address the root causes of these disasters by confronting the climate crisis and ensuring equitable access to resources and support for all.

“It is not lost on us that there are some people who are navigating this crisis while attempting to serve others. We are mindful of our friends and colleagues at the California-Pacific Conference of The United Methodist Church, who are serving even as they are in agony over this challenging time.

“United Women in Faith is urging its members and the public to bolster the United Methodist Church’s efforts to help in relief and recovery by contributing to

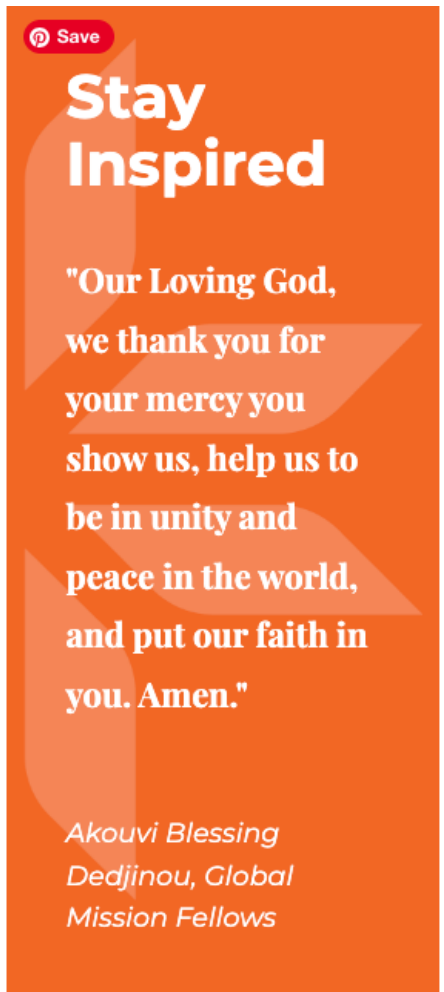
General Conference is more than just voting on legislation. While gathered together, United Methodists from around the world worship, pray, break bread, and lift up causes with one another.

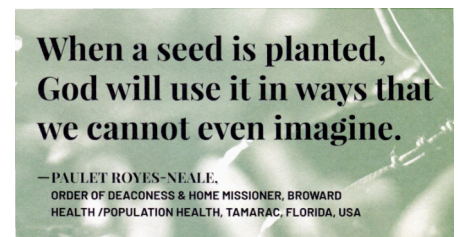
Thanks Prayer
