UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH'S STATEMENT ON THE 2024 PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION

Following the re-election of Donald Trump as the nation's 47th President, United Women in Faith issued the following statement:

NEW YORK—As United Women in Faith, we want to remind our friends and family that our work doesn't begin or end with one election. We have been and will continue to be committed to racial justice, climate justice, gender justice, environmental protections, women's health, immigrants' rights, and human rights. Through our faith we will channel the determination of our foremothers and re-commit ourselves to the perpetual push for justice.

It is true that the electoral results affect us differently depending on our racial identity, religion, citizenship status, sexual orientation, gender identity, and socio-economic status. Nevertheless, we stand in solidarity with the marginalized communities most impacted.

We invite our members and the general public to join us in our **Micah 6:8 pledge**. Through each election cycle the call of our faith endures. We will, therefore, anchor ourselves in the call to remember what the Lord requires of us: "to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with the Lord your God."

This U.S. presidential election saw the first Black and South Asian woman as a major party's nominee. It is indisputable that some hoped for a different outcome. And yet, we must never relent in the struggle to secure policies that advance justice and equity. We must remain engaged in political processes and committed to encouraging support for policies that see, value, and protect women, children, and youth. Let us commit to truly taking care of one another. Let us commit to be in prayer, with bowed heads and through our actions, that those in power prioritize the greater good over selfish gain. United Women in Faith will stand with its members, offering strategies for how women of faith can continue to advocate to achieve our shared goals and build a safe and whole world in which all can know God's freedom and love.

On returning to San Diego, I have had an opportunity to become more involved with Nestor United Methodist Church and with the United Women in Faith. I find my work with UWF particularly rewarding. It is inspiring to learn and work with dedicated faithful women at the local, district, and conference level.

I have three beautiful daughters, a foster daughter, and a foster son. They all have their own children so there are lots of grandkids. I enjoy reading, traveling, walking, and sharing time with family, friends, and my United Women in Faith sisters.

I am looking forward to a new year of UWF activities. I know that when we meet either on-line or in person, we all benefit. We encourage each other, we strengthen our faith, and we have fun! I would also like to hear from you. I would like to hear about activities in your local organizations that have been successful. TREASURER'S REPORT

Dear UWF Sisters,

The media brings **anxiety** into our lives. Our **faith reassures** us: *Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. -John 14:27;* and **directs our efforts:** *Bear one another's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfill the law of Christ. -Galatians 6:2.*

Our General Secretary, Sally Vonner, writes: "No matter what may come in the days ahead, we will get through if we, like Proverbs 4:29 says: *Let (our) eyes look directly forward, and (our) gaze be straight before (us)*, supporting and **being in mission with women, children and youth.**"

Our UWFaith primary efforts in bearing one another's burdens are through **Mission Giving**. The 2023-24 UWFaith Annual Report shows that UWF Program Services rendered by UWFaith and other organizations totaled **\$11.4 MILLION**.

Our Cal-Pac South District has an ambitious goal of \$75,000 in Mission Giving for 2024. At the end of October, we have reached nearly \$49,000 in giving, 65% of our goal. November is critical to our success.

Each Local Organization Unit helps achieve this goal. Review your unit's giving through the year and **submit your final 2024 remittances no later than Tuesday, December 3**, so that I have time to submit them to our Conference Treasurer by December 15. Include all **FIVE CHANNELS OF MISSION GIVING** during the year to be a **Five Star Unit**, which is one of the Mission Today Criteria.

One of the five channels is the World Thank Offering (WTO) given during the Fall. The WTO furthers UWFaith missions in celebration of God's blessings in our lives.

All of these resources, as well as the 2025 books, will be included in the Zoom Training on **Saturday, January 25, 2025, at 9 am**. Please email me at judyedel@san.rr.com if you want to participate. Any interested person, whether or not you are the Program Resources Coordinator for your unit, is welcome to attend.

Some people don't want to buy the books they want to read. I encourage them to check out what the public library has. Some of the books on our reading list are or have been bestsellers and will be available at the library. Michelle Obama's book *Becoming* (category: Leadership Development) is currently on the reading list. If you read it in the previous year and didn't report it, you may report it now. In 2025, Obama's new book *We Carry the Light* (category - Nurturing for Community) will be on the reading list, too. __2. Research current legislation on racial issues and present information as a program or in a church newsletter.

__3. Research what organizations in your community are working to uncover, challenge and transform racism in local systems and institutions. Discuss how you might be a partner and/or support this work.

__4. Develop a Racial Justice action of your own choosing for your local organization or church.


