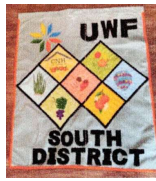

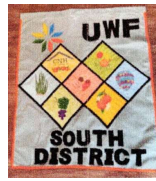

Dear Faithful UWF Sisters,

In 2024, 22 of our South District Units gave over **\$89,000** in undesignated **Mission Giving** through Pledges, World Thank Offerings, Gifts in Memory and Mission, and Special Mission Recognition! In addition, we gave over \$16,000 in designated supplemental gifts to UWFaith projects.

Part of our **UWFaith Purpose** is to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church. Our Mission giving in 2024 helped support nearly 90 National Mission Institutions in the United States and nearly 100 international mission partners.

Giving through the **Five Channels of Mission Giving** enables our National UWFaith leaders to use the funds where they are most needed and do the most good in meeting the needs of women, children, and youth.

We are encouraged to **support all Five Channels** each year and to **concentrate giving towards the Five Channels**. I have the pleasure of awarding certificates to our units that give to all 5 channels ("**5 Star Giving**") and especially to units that concentrate 60% of their total annual expenditures to the 5 channels ("**60/40 Giving**"). The certificates will be announced and handed out at the UWFaith South District Missions Meeting in March at San Diego First UMC.

We help support local and other charities and provide unit administration and membership development and make designated gifts with the remaining 40% of expenditures.

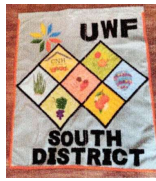

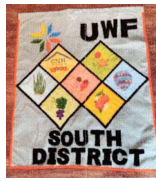

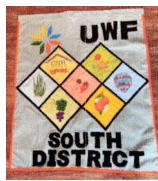

PROGRAM RESOURCES COORDINATOR'S REPORT

Attention All Readers!

I have a special announcement. If your unit does not have someone in charge of the UWFaith Reading Program, I am willing to work with you on your UWFaith Reading Program. You don't even have to buy a book - use the public library instead. You can usually look up the library's catalog (list of books) online. The UWFaith book list is on the UWFaith website at uwfaith.org/resources, or on the web at bit.ly/RPBookList or in the November/December 2024 **response magazine**. Audio books are also acceptable.

Here are some alternative ways to get credits for the Reading Program:

1. Do you plan to attend Mission u in July? You can get 1 book credit for Spiritual Growth when you read the textbook and a second book credit in Spiritual Growth for attending the Mission u class. I want everyone from South District who attends Mission u to send me a Reading Program form claiming these credits.
2. Will you read all 6 issues of **response magazine** for 2025? If so, you will earn 1 book credit in Nurturing for Community.
3. Listen to 2 or more Faith Talk podcasts for 1 book credit in Spiritual Growth. You will find them at uwfaith.org/resources. Only 1 book credit is possible. Each podcast is only 1 hour long. Not many books can be read in only 2 hours.
4. Listen to 2 or more of the quarterly podcasts of *Voices from the Field* for 1 book credit. You can reach the full list of podcasts that are on YouTube from uwfaith.org/resources. In these podcasts, deaconesses and home missionaries tell about their work in various missions. They are commissioned by UWFaith instead of the General Board of Global Ministries and are supervised by the local bishop.
5. Watching any of the following movies will earn 1 book credit each:
 - Hidden Figures - 1 book credit in Leadership Development
 - Pushout - 1 book credit in Social Action
 - The Hate You Give - 1 book credit in Nurturing for Community

If you need a template for a Reading Program Certificate, let me know and I will email it to you.

We encourage everyone who reads even one book to report their reading to me by December 5, 2025. Let me know if you have any questions.

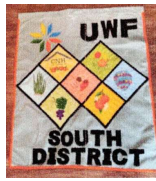

As I write this in January, I am coming off a wonderful weekend which was a joyous reminder of why we as United Women in Faith are called to Social Action. The previous week had been rough on several fronts with the destruction of nearby fires and uncertainties in our country.

On Saturday, several of us gathered on Zoom to explore our responsibilities and opportunities as social action coordinators. We looked at the two justice campaigns from United Women in Faith for the next four years and how we might educate ourselves and our units to make effective changes in our communities.

1. Just Energy for All, helps us learn about climate change and its effects on marginalized women, children and youth. 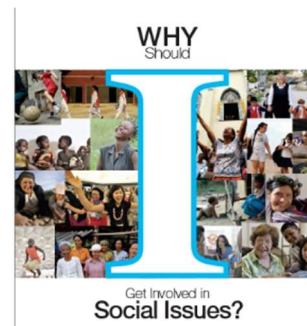

- __3. Study a particular issue relating to the Charter for Racial Justice i.e.: racism, immigration rights, voting rights, racial/ethnic profiling
- __4. Develop an enrichment activity of your own related to Racial Justice

ACTION (complete at least one)

- __1. Gather and share with Local Organization (or Sunday school class or church members) information on local school system regarding ethnic makeup, suspension rate by ethnicity, graduation rate by ethnicity.
- __2. Research current legislation on racial issues and present information as a program or in a church newsletter.
- __3. Research what organizations in your community are working to uncover, challenge and transform racism in local systems and institutions. Discuss how you might be a partner and/or support this work.
- __4. Develop a Racial Justice action of your own choosing for your local organization or church.

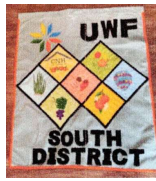

Charter for Racial Justice

United Women in Faith first adopted the “Charter of Racial Policies” in 1952. We worked on ratification at multiple levels of the organization and readopted an updated version in 1962. Throughout the years, we lobbied The United Methodist Church to officially adopt the Charter, seeking to bring its commitments to the full body of the church. The Charter was first received by the General Conference in 1964 and first included in *The Book of Resolutions* in 1980. Since then, it has been updated and readopted regularly by delegates to General Conference. From the 1950s to the present, the Charter has been a core part of our identity.

Because we believe:

1. That God is the Creator of all people and all are God’s children in one family;
2. That racism is a rejection of the teachings of Jesus Christ;
3. That racism denies the redemption and reconciliation of Jesus Christ;
4. That racism robs all human beings of their wholeness and is used as a justification for social, economic, environmental, and political exploitation;
5. That we must declare before God and before one another that we have sinned against our sisters and brothers of other races in thought, in word, and in deed;
6. That in our common humanity in creation all women and men are made in God’s image and all persons are equally valuable in the sight of God;
7. That our strength lies in our racial and cultural diversity and that we must work toward a world in which each person’s value is respected and nurtured;
8. That our struggle for justice must be based on new attitudes, new understandings, and new relationships and must be reflected in the laws, policies, structures, and practices of both church and state.

We commit ourselves as individuals and as a community to follow Jesus Christ in word and in deed and to struggle for the rights and the self-determination of every person and group of persons.

Therefore, as United Methodists in every place across the land, we will unite our efforts within the church to take the following actions:

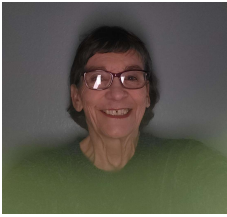
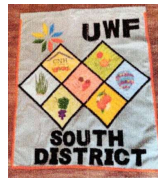
1. Eliminate all forms of institutional racism in the total ministry of the church, giving special attention to those institutions that we support, beginning with their employment policies, purchasing practices, environmental policies, and availability of services and facilities;
2. Create opportunities in local churches to deal honestly with the existing racist attitudes and social distance between members, deepening the Christian commitment to be the church where all racial groups and economic classes come together;
3. Increase efforts to recruit people of all races into the membership of The United Methodist Church and provide leadership-development opportunities without discrimination;
4. Establish workshops and seminars in local churches to study, understand, and appreciate the historical and cultural contributions of each race to the church and community;
5. Raise local churches’ awareness of the continuing needs for equal education, housing, employment, medical care, and environmental justice for all members of the community and to create opportunities to work for these things across racial lines;
6. Work for the development and implementation of national and international policies to protect the civil, political, economic, social, and cultural rights of all people such as through support for the ratification of United Nations covenants on human rights;
7. Support and participate in the worldwide struggle for liberation in church and community;
8. Facilitate nomination and election processes that include all racial groups by employing a system that prioritizes leadership opportunities of people from communities that are disproportionately impacted by the ongoing legacy of racial injustice. Use measures to align our vision for racial justice with actions that accelerate racial equity.

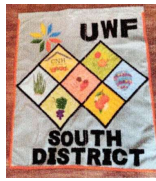

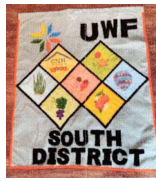

It will include clothing, furniture, kitchenware, books, and all kinds of gently used items in King Hall at:

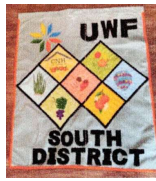
