He also calls those on the anniversary of their loss. What a caring spirit. If the church is in need, he steps up, asking for anonymity.


If he is your friend, he is your friend for life! He still visits the friends in Phoenix that he and Judith had when they lived there.

The Parents of Toddlers Ministry's mission is to establish an opportunity for parents of toddlers in our congregation and local community to fellowship in a Christian environment and grow spiritually as they learn parenting skills.

She has conducted Potty Training Classes in 2020, 2021, 2023, and 2024, with an average attendance of 35 families per class. About 90% of our participants are mothers. The classes are conducted at St Paul's UMC of San Diego. A certified potty-training consultant and a Spanish-speaking translator do the presentations. Grants received from the Georgia Lynch Trust have allowed us to provide potty training chairs, toddler step stools, potty training underwear, potty training charts with stickers, baby wipes, Toddler Bibles, backpacks, and pre-K workbooks for each toddler.

The Potty Training Class's objectives are to provide parents with information and equipment necessary for potty training, ensuring the toddler's readiness for kindergarten occurs on time. These classes help decrease the stress and expense for parents with toddlers during their potty-training journey.

Having a toddler who is potty trained allows them to qualify for low- or no-cost pre-K, saving the family hundreds to thousands of dollars in daycare costs. We believe providing the families with Toddler Bibles will help them develop their Christian values. In addition, the Toddler Bibles will enable parents to teach their toddlers stories of Jesus and other bible stories.

Her plan for 2025 is to hold two classes between July and October.
