





On October 18, over 100 United Women in Faith gathered at First United Methodist Church of North Hollywood for the California-Pacific Conference 53rd Annual Celebration.

What is the annual business meeting for the Conference United Women in Faith? The 2025-2026 Conference Leadership Team was elected and installed, and its operating budget was adopted including our commitment of \$110,000 to mission giving.

It was also a time to remember and honor many in our lives through the lighting of the Candle of Commitment. Burning for three hours and 13 minutes, this represented \$3,196.08 given

God has blessed us to be a blessing to others. **Since 1869, United Women in Faith has been powered by acts of love from women just like you.**

Your support has helped us put love in action for women and children on the margins; spiritually grow and nurture women; equip bold leaders; provide love, justice, and service at home and abroad; and carry out important social action and justice work. **Thank you!**

But there is more work to do and more love to share. This year, we've seen the erasure of jobs, history, and benefits that limit access to needed safety nets, particularly impacting women, children, and other vulnerable groups. United Women in Faith will not be discouraged. **We continue to advocate for justice, putting our hope and love in action, aligning with God's call to be light for the vulnerable, just as one of our foremothers, Isabella Thoburn, did when she set sail for India.** Your Mission Giving dollars support this work.

This bold tradition began in 1869, when eight women in Boston, moved by the plight of their sisters in India, acted. In six months, they raised enough money to send Isabella Thoburn and Dr. Clara Swain to India. **Thoburn boldly launched a women's education program that led to South Asia's first Christian college for women.** What began with six students in 1870 is now Isabella Thoburn College, with 3,500 women enrolled today.

As Thoburn said, **"No people can rise higher as a people than the point to which they educate their women."**
