SHARING HOPE WITH LOVE GIFTS



We have an opportunity to share LOVE GIFTS with Get Together Foundation's Casa de Vida in the West San Fernando Valley. The Foundation is a 501(c)3 organization and is a BBB Accredited charity. We are asking for gift cards to Albertsons, Ralphs or Vons where food, diapers and baby supplies can be purchased. Casa de Vida is a 90-day family crisis shelter that houses up to 12 families nightly. It offers case management, medical and mental health referrals, parenting classes and help in finding childcare and employment. Casa de Vida provides a safe learning and living environment for families, largely single mothers, to build a more stable future. 60% of families served have experienced violence prior to arriving at the facility. Staff trained in domestic violence care and trauma are on-site 24/7 providing care, comfort and security for vulnerable children and parents. Your gifts are needed and very much appreciated. 
During this last year, you have provided me with contact information that I was required to provide to Susan Moberg, and at her direction, and with your support, there were more responses to the national surveys than ever before!

Dear Sisters,



Mission Giving in Action

Mission is the one-word focus of what United Women in Faith is all about. In 1869, eight women in Boston grew a network and funds large enough to send Isabella Thoburn and Clara Swain to India. That was the beginning of a legacy of love that we, as members of UWFaith, continue to support and make real through our pledges and gifts to mission.

Through articles in Response magazine, Faith Talks and Voices from the Field podcasts, our National Missions (we have five in the Cal-Pac Conference), Mission u experiences and more, we see the impact of our Mission Giving! **That's Love in Action!!** In **response** magazine there were articles that showed actions that have been taken, that were made possible through the support and undergirding of UWFaith – such as how our deaconesses demanded justice in the Philippines and how their work led to the arrest of a ruthless president (*response, March/April 2025). Or maybe the article about Bethlehem Centers, our National Mission Institution in Nashville, that showed us how vital Mission Giving is to the seniors who depend on them for their next meal and the children who learn there (response, May/June 2025). Did you see the story about Imayam Social Welfare Association in India, where we are helping to decrease the school dropout rate and let young women know they don't have to fall victim to child marriage and abuse? **Yes, our Mission Giving made all of this possible!**

When we combine our pledges and gifts to mission with those of our sisters from within our conference, we fuel mission that transforms lives! **In our Cal-Pac Conference, we make a difference** in the work of our National Missions: Calexico Neighborhood House, Toberman Neighborhood Center, David and Margaret Youth and Family Services, and The Susannah Wesley Community Center; along with our work as the Women's Auxiliary to the USC Arcadia Hospital.

Sisters, as we witness what is happening in our communities, nation, and the world, we know that there is more work to do and more love to share. Our Cal-Pac Conference UWFaith has been impacted in the past decade by the re-alignment of our districts from eight to five, the Covid pandemic, as well as changes within the United Methodist denomination.

Action: [Tell Congress: Ban Corporal Punishment In Our Schools!](#)

Children deserve safe and supportive schools where they can learn and grow. The use of corporal punishment in schools undermines student safety and well-being. United Women in Faith joins leading organizations across the country to urge passage of The Protecting Our Students in Schools Act of 2025, a federal bill which would prohibit the use of corporal punishment in schools receiving federal funding.

Action: [Counseling Not Criminalization in Schools](#)

When we choose criminalization over counseling in our schools, we are doing the very thing Jesus warns against: causing little ones to stumble. By responding with suspensions, expulsions, or even arrests, we increase trauma, fuel cycles of poverty, and push students out of school and into the justice system. The Gospel calls us to interrupt the school-to-prison pipeline. The federal government can do this by passing The Counseling Not Criminalization in Schools Act.

Dear UWFaith sisters,

It is a pleasure to let you know the latest total for the Legacy endowment Fund reported by the Legacy Development Team. As of June 30, 2025, the Legacy Endowment Fund is \$50,469,466. Per the May 2025 Legacy Conference Giving report the fund total was \$50,080,788. The summary of the latest conference and jurisdiction donations can be found in the June issue of the Pacific Waves. As of this writing, Legacy Liaisons have not received a conference giving report later than the May report.

Per the Legacy Liaisons meeting I attended August 14, 2025, the three ways to donate to the fund contributed to the achievement of this impressive total. These are the ways to contribute to the fund:

Many thanks to you who donated to the fund at the table and purchased the cookie recipe at the North District table. You are helping the conference contribute to the new total by donating \$127. The money has been sent to the United Women in Faith.

If you are able, but you are not contributing to the fund, please consider choosing one of the above mentioned ways to support the fund and help the United Women in Faith achieve its goal of \$60 million dollars sooner than later.

May the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you PEACE




