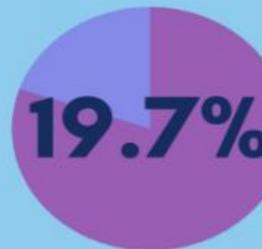
## SEXUAL ABUSE IN SCOUTING

What did victims experience?



**NEARLY 3 IN 4 (71.2%) VICTIMS OF ABUSE IN SCOUTING WERE ABUSED MULTIPLE TIMES.**

Almost **two thirds** (63.9%) of abusers remained in Scouting after victims told Scouting of the abuse.



**19.7% (nearly 1 in 5) of victims of abuse in Scouting were abused by more than one person.**

# 94%

**of child sexual abuse cases reported were done by leaders who had one-on-one contact with a child.**

**Yet the BSA *insists* it prohibits one-on-one interactions between children & adults.**

# REQUIREMENTS FOR YOUR CHURCH

According to CA state law (AB506), HI Chapter 350, Conference policy, insurance (Philadelphia), and best practice, both professionally and pastorally, these are the requirements for your church:

- 1) Your church must have an Abuse Prevention Policy.
- 2) Your church must implement the required background checks and abuse prevention training using either Ministry Safe or Safe Gatherings.
- 3) Your church must implement Livescan fingerprinting background checks. (CA law AB506)
- 4) Your church must implement the procedures delineated in your Abuse Prevention Policy.
- 5) Your preschool must be in compliance with licensing.

# WHO MUST GET A BACKGROUND CHECK, ABUSE PREVENTION TRAINING, AND LIVESCAN FINGERPRINTING?

- All Cal-Pac clergy and Lay Persons Assigned, whether appointed/assigned to local churches or to conference staff, district superintendent positions, or extension ministries
- Camp & Retreat Employees and Volunteers
- All Church Staff and Volunteers who work with children, youth, and/or vulnerable adults.
- All Preschool Staff and Volunteers
- All Staff and Volunteers for Conference-sponsored activities involving children, youth and/or vulnerable adults.
- All paid staff and volunteers at local churches who work with children, youth, and/or vulnerable adults.

## Note:

- Local church employees who do NOT work with children, youth, or vulnerable adults must clear the Safe Gatherings online background check, but do not need Livescan fingerprinting.

# PROCEDURE — LANGUAGE UPDATES

**In the Conference template we clarified some questions about supervision. Here's the clarification:**

\* Where there is a worker who is younger than 18 years of age, there must also be someone who a certified worker in the room.

\* Youth under age 18 serving as leaders or regular volunteer workers in specific ministry areas may take the certification course, but do not qualify as certified workers until they are 18.

\* There must be two certified adults present in all settings. It is never appropriate to be alone with a child at any age. In the rare circumstance where it cannot be avoided, any door must be kept open, or they must be in a situation where they can be observed.

# PROCEDURE — LANGUAGE UPDATES

**We replaced gender-specific language about sleeping arrangements with language that gives you more flexibility to provide appropriate supervision in your ministry context.**

Sleeping arrangements should be made in a way that respects the privacy and dignity of all individuals. Each participant's personal space should be maintained, and arrangement should consider individual needs for comfort and rest. Rooms or sleeping areas will be assigned in a manner that ensures all participants feel safe and respected. Participants may request rooming preferences in advance, which will be considered in room assignments. All sleeping areas will be adequately supervised by trained chaperones, and clear boundaries will be communicated to all participants to maintain a safe environment.

# AB 506 REQUIREMENTS

Fingerprint-based background checks (Live Scan) required for licensed, employment or volunteer position working with children, the elderly or the disabled.

Agencies apply for authorization to conduct Live Scan background checks.

# APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 1: Determine if agency is authorized to submit applicant fingerprints for background checks.

How?

Step 2: Complete and file application for authorization.

- ▶ Identify Custodian of Records for the church.

Church applies under Youth Organization and Human Resources agency

- ▶ Obtain ORI number as qualifying agency.

# APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 3: Determine if your agency is required or wants to receive Subsequent Arrest Notifications once person is employed.

Step 4: Wait for authorization to be approved.

Once approved, send applications for Live Scan using Request for Live Scan Service with the church's ORI number.

COR accesses the DOJ site to check results.

# BASIC TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ Employers with 5 or more employees must provide two hours of sexual harassment training to supervisors every two years.
- ▶ Must also provide at least one hour of sexual harassment training to non-supervisory employees every 2 years.

*NOTE: This training requirement is for all employees, including clergy, and is separate and distinct from training programs such as Safe Gatherings and Ministry Safe that cover prevention of abuse of children, youth and vulnerable adults .*

# TRAINING SPECIFICATIONS

Must be interactive

Must be at least two hours in length (classroom or e-learning); at least one hour for non-supervisory

Must meet certain requirements regarding qualifications of the trainer:

- Attorney; HR professional; harassment prevention consultant; professor/instructor in law school or university

# CAL-PAC CONFERENCE REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ For clergy and lay staff at churches, training conducted in English or Spanish must be done through:

▶ In2vate

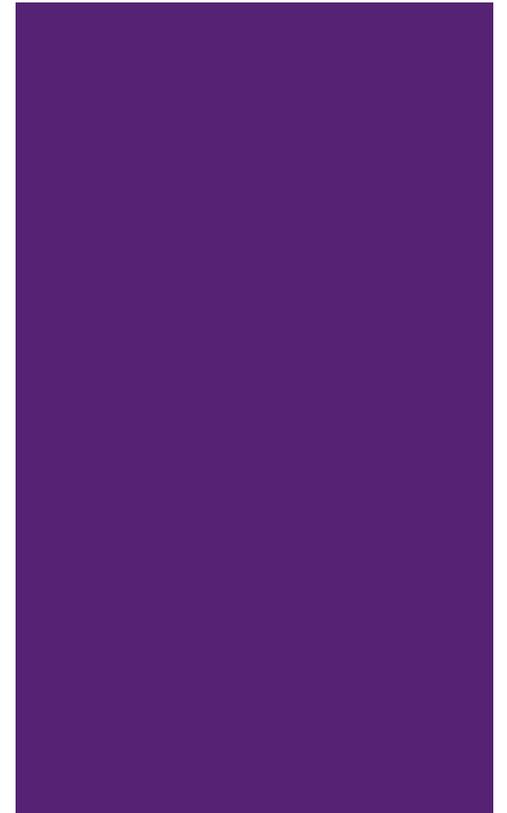
# CAL-PAC CONFERENCE REQUIREMENTS

Each church registers with in2vate

Administrator at church assigns training to all staff

Clergy take the training through their church

Only applies to retired clergy if they are working in retirement at a local church

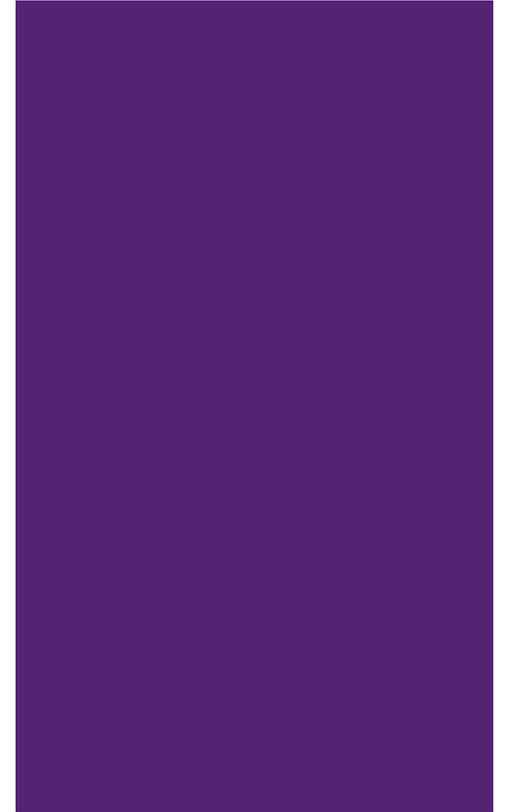

- Your preschool must be in compliance with licensing.

## Who must get a background check, abuse prevention training, and livescan fingerprinting?

- All Cal-Pac clergy and Lay Persons Assigned, whether appointed/assigned to local churches or to conference staff, district superintendent positions, or extension ministries
- Camp & Retreat Employees and Volunteers
- All Church Staff and Volunteers who work with children, youth, and/or vulnerable adults.
- All Preschool Staff and Volunteers
- All Staff and Volunteers for Conference-sponsored activities involving children, youth and/or vulnerable adults.
- All paid staff and volunteers at local churches who work with children, youth, and/or vulnerable adults.

**Note:** Local church employees who do NOT work with children, youth, or vulnerable adults must clear the Safe Gatherings online background check, but do not need Livescan fingerprinting.
